

Cookie Policy

This site uses so-called “cookies”, small portions of text files that are stored on the user’s computer and which serve to make our website easier to use, effective and secure. The cookies used are “session cookies” that have the feature of not being stored permanently on the user’s computer and disappear when the browser is closed.

Data tracking with Google Analytics

This website uses Google Analytics, a web analytics service provided by Google, Inc. (“Google”). Google Analytics uses so-called “cookies”, text files that are stored on your computer and allow the analysis of the use that the user makes of the website. The information generated by cookies through the use of this website are usually transmitted and stored on a Google server in the United States. On behalf of the operator of this website, Google uses this information to monitor the use of the website, to draw up reports on website activity and to provide other services related to the use of the website and the internet to the site operator. The IP address transmitted by the user’s browser in the context of Google Analytics is not associated with other data from Google. The storage of cookies can be blocked by setting your browser software; however, please note that in this case, some features of this website may not work properly. The user can also prevent the detection of data created through cookies and related to the use of the website (including the IP address) to Google and the processing of this data by Google, by downloading and installing the browser plugin available at the following link <http://tools.google.com/dlpage/gaoptout?hl=it>. The user can object to the detection of data by Google Analytics by clicking on the following link. An opt-out cookie will be inserted that prevents the future detection of the data of the user who visits this website: Deactivate Google Analytics.

In any case, there are these alternatives:

Block third-party cookies

Third-party cookies are not generally essential for browsing, so you can reject them by default through the appropriate functions of your browser.

Do Not Track Option

The Do Not Track option is present in most of the latest generation of browsers. When activated, websites designed to respect this option should automatically stop collecting some browsing data. However, not all websites honor this option (at their discretion).

Activate the “anonymous browsing” mode

With this function you can browse without leaving a trace in the data browser. The sites will not remember the visit, the pages visited will not be stored in the browsing history and the new cookies will be cleared.

The anonymous browsing function does not guarantee anonymity on the Internet however, because it serves only to prevent the storing of browsing data in the browser, whereas browsing data will continue to be available to web site managers and connectivity providers.

Delete cookies automatically

There are special functions to do this in all browsers. Be aware that every time you connect to the Internet, new cookies are stored, so cookie deletion should be performed periodically. If desired, some browsers offer automated systems for the periodic clearing of cookies, for example when the browser is closed.
